Jeff Skinner is back taking contact in practice. Give him another week at most.

Erik Karlsson missed last night's game with an upper-body injury. "Not serious" apparently. But the scratch was unexpected.

Mikhail Grabovski's hot streak is starting to bring Kulemin around. Kulemin had two points, three shots and was plus-1. Arguably his best game of the season. Grabovski has 14 points in his last 17 games.

Man, look who wants his job back. That job that he had for what seems like a heartbeat now. Tuukka Rask is 10-4-1 on the season with a 1.59 GAA and a 0.945 SP to lead the entire league in both categories.

Eric Fehr scored his first goal of the season. He bears watching now that the seal is broken. Very streaky.

The Horton-Krejci-Lucic line is hot again. Horton has six points in four games.

Matt Moulson has eight points in his last five games and 25 points in his last 20 games. John Tavares has 12 points in six games and he's fought his way back to nearly a point-per-game on the season.

Kyle Okposo has points in five of his last six games and has 16 points in his last 22. Okposo was moved to the Tavares line, which doesn't bode well for PA Parenteau. Parenteau had a point last night with them, but it came on the power play.

Since returning to action, Mike Smith is only 1-1-2. BUT, he has allowed just one goal in each of his last three games.

Colin Greening had three assists for the Sens. He'll have his hot streaks but I'll be shocked if he ever breaks say 57 points. He's more of a future 50-55 guy.

Milan Michalek continues his Cy Young performance, upping his record to 22-8 last night.

I have Kyle Turris in one of my keeper leagues. Man I'm glad I went after him in the summer and then stuck with him throughout. Another point, gives him eight in 11 games for Ottawa.

The league leader in shots and saves, Craig Anderson, picked up his 21<sup>st</sup> win. That puts him second in that category. In Ottawa overall, he is 32-17-7.

The last time Dwayne Roloson allowed fewer than three goals in a game was November 17 – 10 appearances ago. That's 35 goals allowed in his last nine games.

With two points last night, Casey Wellman has quietly put up six points in 10 games this season and he's a plus player. He's also been good for about two shots per game.

The streaky Viktor Stalberg was probably recently dropped by legions of fantasy owners before getting that hat trick last night. The guy posted seven points in four games and then zero points in six games, including going minus-9 in that span... and now a hat trick. I think shit like that does more harm to us than good!
