The league has to cave on this one. Will they? I think so. Obviously we hope it happens sooner, rather than later. But the problem is, they have already received \$200 million from NBC for this season. That's a nice war chest. The players, meanwhile, will get 8% of last year's salary on October 15, thanks to their escrow being refunded. So a lockout does nothing to them. And furthermore, with memories of the last lockout still fresh, many players have already signed overseas. I remember last lockout it took many players weeks, even months, to make the decision to play elsewhere.

The NHL also will realize that they will get an improvement on the deal that they already have. And the deal they already have gives them cost certainty.

As noted - Phoenix's farm team (Portland) is going to have better D than some NHL teams. Other thoughts:

Edmonton's farm team (Oklahoma City) is almost as good as Edmonton will be. It's pretty much the Oilers minus goaltending, Whitney, Hemsy, Horcoff, Smyth and Yakupov.

Minnesota's farm team (Houston) may be the best of them all - with studs on the ice in front of a stud goaltender ( [Matt Hackett](#) ), I'll be watching as many of their games as I can.

I made Jack Maclellan notable because he was a top college player last season. He signed with Nashville and stayed with the big club, but never got into a game. So we have no idea how he does as a pro, because he's never played pro hockey.

Those players who have had a tough go of it while being a little rushed to the NHL can now reboot in the AHL. If this lasts longer than two months, this will be very good for these players. I'm talking about Niederreiter, Paajarvi, Burmistrov, Johansen, Tedenby and Larsson. If the lockout lasts two months, I predict that at least two of these players will make an immediate splash in the NHL when they return.
