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First, the NHL news. The league and the union have decided to go to a [mediator](#) . They did this, I believe, three times during the last lockout. The second time was in early February and when that one failed Gary Bettman canceled the season. The first time, was around this time eight years ago. This will get them talking and on the bright side, the gap isn't as big as last time.

Mediation did not work in football and basketball, but [the NHL gives it a go](#) - a column by James Mirtle.

The initial mediator assigned, Guy Serota, was removed from the position mere hours after being given the job. His Twitter account was hacked and the hacker said some controversial things. 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[Sergei Kostitsyn](#) has really found his groove in the KHL, posting 21 points in 17 games. If he can ride that wave of confidence back to Nashville, he could find that elusive 60-point barrier that so many skilled Nashville guys miss out on. I have him in one keeper. Was souring on him, but this makes me feel a little better. I know points don't translate, but I believe confidence does.
