The 22-year-old undersized defenseman was signed to an AHL contract in Grand Rapids after finishing up a four-year NCAA career at Ferris State. He has 16 points in 17 games in the AHL as a rookie after scoring seven goals and adding 22 assists in his final year at Ferris State.

The 5-10, 175 pound defenseman is in the right system – [Detroit knows how to develop its young players.](#)

*Billins was far from the stereotypical college athlete some people might envision. He takes great pride in being a true student-athlete or, in his case, a scholar-athlete. It's not an NCAA line for him – student-athlete has been a way of life at college for Billins. In addition to being a first-team All-CCHA honoree for his play on the ice, the league bestowed another great honor on him to recognize the work Billins does in the classroom. He was named winner of the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award.*

Ryan Murray is out for the season with a [torn shoulder labrum](#) (same injury as [Taylor Hall](#) and [Ryan Kesler](#)).

*Team Canada will have the luxury of two returning defencemen with Hamilton and London Knights captain [Scott Harrington](#). The likes of Detroit Red Wings prospect Xavier Ouellet of the QMJHL's B-B Armada could round out a solid top-four.*

Murray's [shoulder has been bugging him for some time](#) (again, just like Hall and Kesler).

*The Blue Jackets were first alerted that his shoulder was sore at development camp after the draft in July, but it was considered a minor annoyance. But Murray said the shoulder had been getting increasingly sore so far this season with Everett (WHL), to the point where he had an MRI scheduled for Nov. 20 ... four days after the injury occurred.*

One suggestion:

*For core training, focus on rotational power and stability. Ditch the sit-ups and crunches. Work on explosive power with med ball work (if your gym allows it), or use the cables. Learn how to plank and side plank properly – they are very beneficial exercises but most people don’t do them correctly. And don’t forget that your “core” is always working when you are exercising,*

Florida defenseman [Erik Gudbranson](#) is back on the ice after [suffering a serious shoulder injury during the summer.](#)

*Had Gudbranson not gotten injured, he likely would have joined the Rampage for training camp in September. Gudbranson is now eligible to play minor league hockey even during the lockout. Only Gudbranson got hurt. And, because the injury didn't happen on the ice, he's locked out — and not being paid — like everyone else.*

*Gudbranson's injury had been shrouded in secrecy as teammates declined to talk about it, saying "you need to speak with Erik." On Monday, Gudbranson finally came public about how he got hurt, telling *The Miami Herald* it happened while wakeboarding on a lake in Ontario with his buddies.*

I'd say No. 1 overall (for Rielly) is defensible."*
