, and he hails from Chanhassen, MN, not West Vancouver, BC.

So yes, they both are defenseman that shoot left-handed, are similar in size, and are NHL draftees, yet the two come from different countries and their current hockey career path differs a bit too. Rielly has been honing his game in the major junior ranks for two years while Reilly just last season help lead his team, the Penticton Vees, to a BCHL Championship (Fred Page Cup) and is now off the University of Minnesota this fall.

Reilly recently participated at USA Hockey's National Junior Evaluation Camp in Lake Placid, NY last month. I had heard his game was blossoming, and he quite honestly made a case as the best player on the ice for the week. Not just from the 45-players Americans at camp, but also the mix of Swedish & Finnish participants too.

He showed tremendous offensive abilities by leading the rush, wheeling and dealing with the puck on his stick, wringing beauties in the net, and setting up teammates too. He is a slick skating blue liner who showed his speed with the puck and also without. He possesses high-end vision and playmaking talents. The bigger ice surface of the Herb Brooks Arena suited this Minnesotan just fine. The same sized ice sheet will be available in December at Ufa, Russia for the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championships.
